**APPROVAL OF BOARD MINUTES**

Hufft moved to approve the March 16-17, 2011 Board Meeting minutes with corrections noted. Davis seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

**SITE VISIT REPORTS**

**Georgia Perimeter College**

Georgia Perimeter College's February 21-22, 2011 site visit report was reviewed. Hufft moved to approve the following commendations:

2. The protocol of the Assessment Technologies, Inc. (ATI) testing package must be clearly documented on all syllabi and the in the Department Handbook. [410-3-.04 (11);410-3-.07 (2)]
3. Review the Summary of Clinical Performance and Anecdotal Summary Notes to clarify critical behaviors and expected levels of performance and the impact of unsatisfactory performance on the overall grade. [410-3-.05 (7)]
4. Any full-time faculty member with only baccalaureate degree in nursing must be able to document progress toward an earned graduate degree in nursing. [410-3-.05]
5. Review the ratio of full-time to part-time faculty members per semester to that full-time faculty members are in the majority. [410-3-.05]


