Cranfill called the meeting to order at 3:33 p.m. on Monday, June 11, 2012. The Board worked as a committee to conduct disciplinary matters until a quorum was present.

### **PETITION WAIVER – OGHLEOGHENE KOLO**

Barton moved to deny request for a waiver. The Board does not have the authority to waive a statute. Chatman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Rowe moved, Barnett seconded and the Board voted to enter into **Executive Session** in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 43-1-2(k); 43-1-19(h), 43-26-5(c) and 43-26-11, to deliberate on applications and enforcement matters and to receive information on applications, investigative reports and pending cases. The motion passed unanimously.

At the conclusion of the Executive Session on Monday, June 11, 2012, Cranfill declared the meeting to be “open” pursuant to the Open and Public Meeting Act, O.C.G.A. §§ 50-14-1 et seq.

### **INVESTIGATIONS**

(RNI – Registered Nurse Investigative Case Number)

**RNI120439/RNI120619/RNI120725/RNI120726** – Chatman moved to refer to the Attorney General’s office for summary suspension based on imminent threat to health, safety and welfare of the public per O.C.G.A. § 50-13-18(c)(1). Barnett seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

**RNI100880/RNI120688** – Barton moved to refer to the Attorney General’s office for a hearing or private interim suspension order not to practice until treatment records indicate that licensee is safe to practice. The order should be hand served. Treatment records from St. Simons By the Sea should be subpoenaed. Rowe seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

### **REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION**

(RNI – Registered Nurse Investigative Case Number)

**RNI100140** – Barnett moved to deny licensure based on violations of consent order and relapse. Rowe seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

**VIOLATION OF CONSENT ORDER**

(RNI – Registered Nurse Investigative Case Number)

**RNI100657** – Barton moved to refer to the Attorney General’s office for a hearing or amended public consent order to include probation for four (4) years, substance abuse stipulations, two (2) years narcotic restrictions and quarterly reports (employer, aftercare and personal) and a fine of \$500 for submission of false documents. Rowe seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.


**REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION**

(RNI – Registered Nurse Investigative Case Number)

**RNI111003** – Chatman moved to deny request for home health employment based on the Board’s belief that it is important for impaired individuals not to work in unsupervised home health settings. Licensee must resign from any home healthcare positions upon receipt and cannot work unsupervised in home setting. Hufft seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
