Mann called the meeting to order at 4:04 p.m. on Thursday, April 2, 2015.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Fletcher moved, Scott seconded and the Board voted to enter into **Executive Session** in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 43-1-2(k); 43-1-19(h), 43-26-5(c) and 43-26-11, to deliberate on applications and enforcement matters and to receive information on applications, investigative reports and pending cases. The motion passed unanimously.

At the conclusion of the Executive Session on Thursday, April 2, 2015 Mann declared the meeting to be “open” pursuant to the Open and Public Meeting Act, O.C.G.A. §§ 50-14-1 et seq. No votes were taken during executive session.

### **INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE CASES**

(LPNI = Licensed Practical Nurse Investigative Case Number) (RNI=Registered Nurse Investigative Case Number)

Scott moved to present the following recommendations to the Board.

**LPNI150328** – License with a Letter of Concern (Criminal).

**RNI140059** – Close the case.

**RNI150869** – Renew the license.

**RNI150870** – License with a Letter of Concern (Alcohol). Licensee must provide documentation of completion of probation within ten (10) days of completion.

**LPNI150086** – Send a mitigating letter requesting courses in Professional Conduct, Dealing with Dementia and Communication.

**LPNI150188** - Send a mitigating letter requesting courses in Medication Administration, Communication, and Dealing with Dementia.

**LPNI150299** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a private consent order to include five (5) years monitoring, quarterly reports (employer, personal, aftercare, psychotherapy).

**LPNI150233** – Licensee must comply within thirty (30) days or refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension or voluntary surrender.

**RNI150772** - Refer to the Attorney General's office for a private consent order to include five (5) years monitoring and quarterly reports (employer, personal, aftercare, psychotherapy).

**RNI150209** - Refer to the Attorney General's office for a hearing or a public consent order to include a fine of \$500 for Failure to Disclose and a fine of \$500 for Action in Another Jurisdiction.

**RNI150479** - Refer to the Attorney General's office for revocation or voluntary surrender of license.

**RNI140010** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a private consent order to include two (2) years monitoring, one (1) year narcotics restriction and quarterly reports (employer, personal, aftercare, psychotherapy).

**RNI150471** – Close the case.

**RNI150094** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an outpatient mental physical examination from a Board approved evaluator. Results are to be reviewed by the Investigative Committee member and the Legal/Discipline Nurse Consultant.

**RNI150198** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension. Licensee may petition for lifting suspension after 24 months of documented sobriety and an outpatient mental physical examination from a Board approved evaluator completed within 30 days of the petition by the Investigative Committee member and the Legal/Discipline Nurse Consultant.

**RNI150616** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an expedited outpatient mental physical examination from a Board approved evaluator. Results are to be reviewed by the Investigative Committee and the Legal/Discipline Nurse Consultant.

**RNI150354** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a voluntary surrender of license.

**RNI150370** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a hearing or an expedited outpatient mental physical examination from a Board approved evaluator. Results are to be reviewed by the Investigative Committee member and the Legal/Discipline Nurse Consultant.

**RNI150392** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a private consent order to include five (5) years monitoring and quarterly reports (personal, employer, aftercare).

**RNI150394** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension or voluntary surrender.

**RNI150419** – Close the case with a Letter of Concern (Unprofessional Conduct).

**RNI150430** – Close the case.

**RNI150469** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a public consent order to include a fine of \$500 for Action in Another Jurisdiction.

**RNI150554** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension. Licensee may petition for lifting suspension after 24 months of documented sobriety and an outpatient mental physical examination from a Board approved evaluator completed within 30 days of the petition by the Investigative Committee member and the Legal/Discipline Nurse Consultant.

**LPNI140104** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension or voluntary suspension.

**LPNI060170** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for an indefinite suspension or voluntary suspension.

**RN150424** – Deny the request.


**RNI140492** – Refer to the Attorney General's office for a public consent order to include three (3) years probation, quarterly reports (personal, employer, aftercare) and a fine of \$500 for Actions in Another Jurisdiction . Licensee must show five (5) years sobriety to petition for lifting.

**RNI150847** – Close the case.

**RNI100112** – Revoke the license.

Schilling seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
