Ms. Klock-Powell motioned, Ms. Real seconded and the Board voted to accept the AG's Memo of Authority as presented and to post the proposed rule amendments to rule 135-5-.05 and 135-5-.06 for the minimum thirty days for public view with a public rules hearing to be scheduled for the next available date following the thirty day public posting. None opposed, motion carried.

Board Discussion regarding the reasoning and rational for recommended MFT rule revisions to 135-5-.05 and 135-5-.06:

135-5-.05 Associate Marriage and Family Therapist

(1) Definitions and Requirements:

(a) Board Approved Marriage and Family Therapy Supervisor

1. Three years of full-time post-licensure experience in the practice of marriage and family therapy:

The Board has not previously required that Board approved MFT Supervisors have any post initial licensure clinical experience. MFT's are the only discipline that does not require any initial post licensure experience. MFT Board members have noted an increase in applications that list supervisors that have little post licensure experience and some increase in complaints of LAMFTs that are supervised by supervisors with little experience. A review of other MFT state licensure boards show that most require between 3-5 years of licensed experience prior to being eligible for supervisory status.

(i) Direction

1. Directors may not provide direction to family members. In addition, directors shall not provide direction for any practitioner when that practitioner has, or any of that practitioner's family members have, an ownership interest in, operate, or manage the business entity in which the director is employed and/or where the professional marriage and family therapy services are to be provided by that practitioner.

2. Family member means a member of a person's immediate or extended family, by direct descent or by marriage, including intimate or cohabitation relationships.

These requirements for Directors are added to be consistent with Code of Ethics language regarding dual relationships and conflict of interest issues related to best practices. The Professional Practices Committee (complaints) has had complaint issues related to this conflict of interest that potentially prohibit applicants under direction and supervision from getting the quality experience necessary to practice at the highest level and protect the public. All discipline Codes of Ethics prohibit these types of dual relationships.

(l) Program Equivalent to a Marriage and Family Therapy Degree Program

.....three courses in human development, one of which must be a course in either psychopathology or the diagnosis of mental problems and conditions; one....

(m) Program in Marriage and Family Therapy

.....three courses in human development, one of which must be a course in either psychopathology or the diagnosis of mental problems and conditions; one...

The requirement of a course in either psychopathology or the diagnosis of mental problems and conditions was added here to be consistent with the April 2016 statutory amendments in 2016 [SB 319/Act 377 – Effective 04/26/2016: O.C.G.A. §§ 43-10A-3(4.1 and 10) and 43-10A-16(b)] and the recently adopted new Board rule, 135-5-.12 Testing and Diagnosis. This course is now required for all LAMFT and MFT applicants.

(n) Supervision

1. Supervisors may not provide supervision to family members. In addition, supervisors shall not provide supervision for any practitioner when that practitioner, or any of that practitioner's family members have, an ownership interest in, operate, or manage the business entity in which the supervisor is employed and/or where the professional marriage and family therapy services are to be provided by that practitioner.

2. Family member means a member of a person's immediate or extended family, by direct descent or by marriage, including intimate or cohabitation relationships.

These requirements for Supervisors are added to be consistent with Code of Ethics language regarding dual relationships and conflict of interest issues related to best practices. The Professional Practices Committee (complaints) has had multiple complaint issues related to this conflict of interest that potentially prohibit applicants under direction and supervision from getting the quality experience necessary to practice at the highest level and protect the public. All discipline Codes of Ethics prohibit these types of dual relationships.

(c) Contract

The changes here require the applicant to submit a Contract for Post Graduate Experience and Supervision within 30 days of employment. The Board has had problems with applicants submitting contracts well into or as they complete their work experience and have had their work experience denied. This time limit will ensure that applicant work sites are approved as they start and will not be rejected later. The requirement of submitting new contracts for new work sites also ensures that the clinical experience will count. These changes protect the applicant from having to repeat up to two years of clinical experience and ensure that applicants get a quality and appropriate clinical experience.

(d) Examination

This was added to state the examination requirement and the specific examination. The Board previously required an exam but were not specific about this in the rules.

135-5-.06 Marriage and Family Therapist

(1) Definitions and Requirements:

(b) Board Approved Graduate ~~Level~~ Course means a course in Marriage and Family Studies, Marriage and Family Therapy, or Marriage and Family Therapy Ethics which is offered by a training institute, is comparable to a graduate level course offered by an accredited educational institution, and has received prior approval by the Board. *(Remainder of existing paragraph language removed)*

The changes here propose that the Board eliminate the approved MFT training institutes. These are programs that are not offered through accredited universities. There were originally approved in the 1990's prior to on-line university education and when there were no MFT programs in Atlanta and much of Georgia. There is no active oversight of these programs by accreditation programs and the Board has begun receiving complaints regarding quality issues with some of the programs. The Board does not have the time or resources to provide oversight of these training institutes. All required MFT academic courses are now easily available through accredited universities in Atlanta and throughout Georgia at multiple sites, negating the need for these training institutes. The rule allows for a 2 year period for all training institute students to finish coursework that they have begun.

(c) Board Approved Marriage and Family Therapy Supervisor

1. Three years of full-time post-licensure experience in the practice of marriage and family therapy:

The Board has not previously required that Board approved MFT Supervisors have any post initial licensure clinical experience. MFT's are the only discipline that does not require any initial post licensure experience. MFT Board members have noted an increase in applications that list supervisors that have little post licensure experience and some increase in complaints of LAMFTs that are supervised by supervisors with little experience. A review of other MFT state licensure boards show that most require between 3-5 years of licensed experience prior to being eligible for supervisory status.

(d) Contract for Post Graduate Supervision

The Board has recommended removing this requirement for administrative reasons. This is an LAMFT requirement only. Requiring potential applicants to submit contracts when they do not have an application before the Board and no file creates an administrative dilemma.

(i) Direction

1. Directors may not provide direction to family members. In addition, directors shall not provide direction for any practitioner when that practitioner has, or any of that practitioner's family members have, an ownership interest in, operate, or manage the business entity in which the director is employed and/or where the professional marriage and family therapy services are to be provided by that practitioner.
2. Family member means a member of a person's immediate or extended family, by direct descent or by marriage, including intimate or cohabitation relationships.

These requirements for Directors are added to be consistent with Code of Ethics language regarding dual relationships and conflict of interest issues related to best practices. The Professional Practices Committee (complaints) has had multiple complaint issues related to this conflict of interest that potentially prohibit applicants under direction and supervision from getting the quality experience necessary to practice at the highest level and protect the public. All discipline Codes of Ethics prohibit these types of dual relationships.

(p) Supervision

1. Supervisors may not provide supervision to family members. In addition, supervisors shall not provide supervision for any practitioner when that practitioner, or any of that practitioner's family members have, an ownership interest in, operate, or manage the business entity in which the supervisor is employed and/or where the professional marriage and family therapy services are to be provided by that practitioner.
2. Family member means a member of a person's immediate or extended family, by direct descent or by marriage, including intimate or cohabitation relationships.

These requirements for directors were added to be consistent with Code of Ethics dual relationship and conflict of interest issues related to best practices. The PPC has had complaint issues related to this conflict of interest that potentially prohibit applicants under direction and supervision from getting the quality experience necessary to practice at the highest level and protect the public. All discipline Codes of Ethics prohibit these types of dual relationships.

2. Supervision.

(i) Such supervision shall have been provided by:

(I) a licensed marriage and family therapist, professional counselor, clinical social worker, psychiatrist, or psychologist who shall have been licensed and in good standing for a minimum of three years; or
(II) an American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT) Approved Supervisor, a Georgia Board Approved Marriage and Family Therapy Supervisor, or a person who was receiving supervision-of-supervision in order to qualify for either designation.

The Board has not previously required that Board approved MFT Supervisors have any post initial licensure clinical experience. MFT's are the only discipline that does not require any initial post licensure experience. MFT Board members have noted an increase in applications that list supervisors that have little post licensure experience and some increase in complaints of LAMFTs that are supervised by supervisors with little experience. A review of other MFT state licensure boards show that most require between 3-5 years of licensed experience prior to being eligible for supervisory status.

(iii) A minimum of 5 hours of such supervision must have been obtained concurrent with each 100 hours of direct clinical experience.

This was added to ensure that all supervision is concurrent with clinical experience. The Board has had problems with applicants going weeks or months while doing clinical practice without concurrent supervision. This specific language will ensure that all clinical practice is under concurrent supervision and providing best practice.

Other minor changes are the same as in 135-5-.05. Rational for these changes in 135-5-.06 are the same.

Ms. Real motioned, Ms. Klock-Powell seconded and the Board voted to accept the AG's Memo of Authority as presented and to post the proposed rule amendments to rule 135-9-.01 and 135-9-.02 for the minimum thirty days for public view with a public rules hearing to be scheduled for the next available date following the thirty day public posting. In addition, the Board voted to table any further discussion regarding Board rule 135-9-.03. None opposed, motion carried.

Board Discussion regarding the reasoning and rational for recommended MFT rule revisions to 135-9-.01 and 135-9-.02:

The proposed changes of Board rules 135-9-.01 and 135-9-.02 include, but are not limited to, the following: The purpose of this rule is to establish clear definitions of each continuing education hour's activity areas, define continuing education audits and revise the flow of the rule language to read in a more succinct manor. The rule amendments establish clear definitions of each continuing education hour's activity area, including defining synchronous and asynchronous activities in order to add/define acceptable online classes, courses previously not defined. The rule amendments define the time frame for obtainment of continuing education hours and the license types required to obtain continuing education hours for renewal to alleviate confusion by licensees. The rule

amendments include the language of the proposed repeal of Board Rule 135-9-.02 Documentation, and defines a continuing education hours audit by the Board.
