Call to Order

Review of Rule Waiver Requests

Review of Board Rule 121-2-.05

The Board discussed Board Rule 121-2-.05.

Discussion of Licensure for Military Spouses and Transitioning Service Members

The Board discussed previously proposed language for a rule for licensure for military spouses and transitioning service members. The Board was informed of Rule 121-2-.05 which currently has language for licensure by endorsement. After review of all the information a motion was made regarding the following rule. A motion was made by Graham, seconded by Hayes, and the Board voted to refer the following rule to the Attorney General's Office for a memorandum of authority. The entire Construction Industry Licensing Board will have to vote on the rule before it can be posted.

Licensure by Endorsement for Military Spouses and Transitioning Service Members

Military spouses and Transitioning Service members may qualify for an Electrical Contractor Class 1 license by endorsement where the applicant:

- (a) Has submitted a completed military application;
- (b) Hold a license from another state for which the training experience, and testing substantially meet or exceed the requirements under this state;
- (c) Has submitted a verification of licensure in good standing from the endorsing state as part of the application.

(1) Transitioning service members may qualify for a Residential Light-Commercial Contractor license by examination where the applicant:

- (a) Has submitted a completed military application and requisite fee;

(b) Has provided proof applicant has obtained a specialty, certification, training or experience in the military while a service member which substantially meets or exceeds the requirements to obtain a license in this state;

(c) Has met the following Military Occupation Specialties:

Army – Interior Electrician
MOS 21R (rank E5 or above)
Prime Power Production Specialist
MOS 12P(rank E5 or above)

Air Force – Electrical Systems
AFSC 3EoX1 (rank E5 or above)
Electrical Power Production
AFSC 3EoX2 (rank E5 or above)

Marine Corps – Electrician/Engineer
Equipment Electrical Systems Technician
MOS 1141/1142
Rank Pvt-SSgt

Navy – NEC-EM
Electricians Mate
Rank E5 and above

(d) Has successfully passed the state examination
