Call to Order Mr. Knowles established that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m.

OPEN SESSION

Agenda Ms. Nichols motioned, Ms. Clay seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to accept the agenda as presented.

Open Session Minutes

1. January 17, 2018 Board Teleconference Minutes

Ms. Clay motioned, Ms. Nichols seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to approve the January 17, 2018 open session Board teleconference minutes as amended for grammatical errors.

Licenses to Ratify November 24, 2017 – February 9, 2018

Ms. Nichols motioned, Ms. Clay seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to ratify the licenses by application and by reinstatement that were issued in accordance with Board Rules and Policies between Board meetings.

Correspondence – CranioSacral Therapy – Maija Salins

Ms. Clay motioned, Ms. Nichols seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to notify the writer that the course falls within the exceptions of the law identified in O.C.G.A. § 43-24A-19, thus it does not fall

within the scope of massage therapy in the state of Georgia. As energy practices are within the exceptions of the law; they can only be changed by the state legislature. The Board has no authority to repeal, amend, vary or waive the statute. The Board cannot accept the course based on the amount of energy work in the course.

As energy practices are within the exception of the law; they can only be changed by the state legislature. The Board has no authority to repeal, amend, vary or waive the statute. The Board has considered the correspondence and has voted to uphold its decision.

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Nichols seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to notify the writer that that the course falls within the exceptions of the law identified in O.C.G.A. § 43-24A-19, thus it does not fall within the scope of massage therapy in the state of Georgia. As energy practices are within the exception of the law; they can only be changed by the state legislature. The Board has no authority to repeal, amend, vary or waive the statute. The Board has considered the correspondence and has voted to uphold its decision.

Correspondence – CE Question – Why Do Some Techniques Not Qualify? - Chris Donohue

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Clay seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to notify the writer that if the course topic falls within the exceptions of the law identified in O.C.G.A. § 43-24A-19, it does not fall within the scope of massage therapy in the state of Georgia. As such, exceptions are identified in the law; they can only be changed by the state legislature. The Board has no authority to repeal, amend, vary or waive the statute; therefore, no exceptions may be granted.

Correspondence – Concerns About Qi Gong Courses Not Accepted – Melanie Nichols

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Nichols seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to notify the writer that the Board went to great lengths to alert licensees to the upcoming change. As the change was made in August of 2015, the Board waited until end of the renewal cycle which was October of 2016 to fully enforce the requirements. Notifications of these changes were posted on website in order to alert all licensees the changes. The Board encourages you to review the website regularly, to include the Board minutes, to ensure that you remain abreast of any changes in requirements.

Correspondence – Request for Open Forum on Practice Act Changes – Nicole Wetherington

1. Initial Response to Nicole Wetherington

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Clay seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to notify the writer that the Board formed a position statement on the proposed bill that was presented, in open session, during the January 13, 2017 Board meeting. The Board's position statement was posted on the Board website. The Board had not considered any subsequent versions of the bill until it was proposed to the legislature this year as the role of the Board is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public and the powers of the Board does not include adopting or revising statutes [O.C.G.A. § 43-24A-2]. In addition, the Board's role is not to look out for the interests of massage therapists as that is the role of a lobby or a trade group. It is suggested that the writer contact their representatives in the General Assembly or AMTA-GA regarding statutory revisions.

If she is not practicing massage therapy as defined in the statute, she does not need a license.

The Board reviewed the current Proposed Massage Therapy Bill O.C.G.A. § 43-24A and accepted it as information.

Petition for Rule Waiver

1. Rule Waiver – BR 345-4-.05(2)(c)(iii) – Megan Williams – MT006240

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Clay seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to grant the petition for waiver of Board Rule 345-4-.05(2)(c)(iii) based on sufficient evidence to substantiate a hardship.

2. Rule Waiver – BR 345-8-.03 – Urquhart, Tiffany

Ms. Clay motioned, Ms. King seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to deny the petition for waiver of Board Rule 345-8-.03 based on insufficient evidence to substantiate a hardship and successful completion a board recognized educational program consisting of a minimum of 500 hours of course and clinical work is a statutory requirement which cannot be waived [O.C.G.A. § 43-24A-8(b)(6)]. The program's NCBTMB School Provider Code did not exist at the time the applicant enrolled and completed the program.

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Clay seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to table the petition for waiver of Board Rule 345-4-.05 pending receipt of additional information to support the petition. If additional information supports the petitioner's statements, grant a waiver of the MBLEx requirement in BR 345-4-.05(2)(c)(ii). If the information does not support the petitioner's statements, deny the petition due to insufficient evidence to substantiate a hardship.

4. Rule Waiver – BR 345-4-.05(2)(c) – Campbell, Kasie Hicks

Ms. King motioned, Ms. Nichols seconded and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to deny the petition for waiver of Board Rule 345-4-.05(2)(c) based on insufficient evidence to substantiate a substantial hardship.
