Close the case on Respondent 2 with a Letter of Concern regarding direct supervision and encourage the Respondent to review and understand the laws and rules and apply them accordingly.

Close with a Letter of Concern regarding compliance with all State and Federal laws concerning tracking, monitoring, prescribing, and dispensing of drugs, particularly controlled substances.
