Substantive Changes

Education – 23 – Georgia Highlands College – Change in Leadership

Georgia Highlands College (EDUCATION 23) The board was notified by Dr. Paula Stover, Interim Director of Nursing on April 1, 2022, that Georgia Highlands had appointed a Dean to the School of Health Sciences. Dr. Lisa Jellum, EdD has an extensive background in leading and providing high quality education. She had served as the Interim Dean of the School of Health Sciences.

According to Board Rule 410-8-.11(2) all programs must submit a report of all substantive changes. I recommend acceptance of this substantive change/notifications. See documentation in the board packet on the Bridge.

Education – 24A and 24B – Lanier Technical College – Change in Approval Status

Lanier Technical College ASN (EDUCATION 08A)

On April 20, 2022, Ms. Leanna Valentine, MSN, RN, CNE Director of the ASN Program wrote the board asking for full approval. The program currently holds Initial Approval, and the entire first cohort (20 graduates) has taken the NCLEX-RN; out of 20 students, 17 have passed as first-time test writers within one calendar year of the graduation date, which was December 13, 2021.

According to Board Rule 410-8-.01(d) The Board may grant Full Approval to a nursing education program with Initial Approval when review of the most recent annual report, the most recent site visit report, and program responses to it document compliance with the rules. At least eighty (80) percent of all graduates must pass the licensing examination as first-time writers within one (1) calendar year of the graduation date. See documentation in the board packet on the Bridge,

I recommend acceptance of this substantive change/notifications.

Education – 25 – South College – Change in Leadership

South College (EDUCATION 19)

On April 25, 2022, Dr. Deb Jennings, DNP, MSN, RN, the Dean of South College notified the board that Dr. Trina Rodgers has been appointed Associate Dean for the Atlanta Nursing program.

According to Board Rule 410-8-.11(2) all programs must submit a report of all substantive changes and Board Rule 410-8-.03 (3) The Board must be notified within 30 days of a change in the nurse administrator. See documentation in the board packet on the Bridge.

I recommend acceptance of this substantive change/notifications.

Education – 26 - Southern Crescent Technical College- Leadership Change

Southern Crescent Technical College (EDUCATION 26)

On April 18, 2022, Ms. Kimberly Register, MSN(Ed), RN, Dean for Academic Affairs notified the board that there had been a change in the College president. Our new President, effective April 18, 2022, is Dr. Irvin T. Clark, Ed.D. Dr. Clark has more than 20 years of experience in higher education, including leading Georgia Piedmont Technical College's (GPTC) Economic Development

division since 2017.

Licensure Issues

Education – 21 - License #3002199

#3002199 (EDUCATION 21)

CFGNS reviewed international applicant #3002199 and found a deficiency of 15 hours of Clinical in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing. (See documentation in the Board Packet on the Bridge).

I recommend that applicant #3002199 complete the 15 hours of Psychiatric/Mental health Clinical and then can be eligible to be licensed as a Professional Registered Nurse in Georgia.

Education - 19 – LPN Licensure by Endorsement #2993800

LPN Licensure by Endorsement #2993800 – (EDUCATION 19)

LPN applicant #2993800 applied to Georgia by endorsement from New York. The applicant completed an ASN program in 12/21/2003. In 2002 she took the LPN board as is allowed in New York. She passed the NCLEX-PN. She completed her ASN program and sat for the NCLEX-RN and did not pass. She has worked since 2004 as an LPN in New York. She moved to GA to start a job at Wellstar but as she has not gotten a license, they rescinded the offer.

According to board Rule 410-3-.02(1)(g) which states: Documentation of one of the following within four years immediately preceding the date of application: Five hundred (500) hours of licensed practice as a licensed practical nurse as documented on the verification of employment form provided by the Board; or Graduation from a nursing education program as defined in O.C.G.A. §§ 43-26-32(1.1) (see below); or Completion of a Board approved reentry program as defined in Rule 410-4-.04. O.C.G.A. §§ 43-26-32(1.1)(1) "Active practice as a licensed practical nurse" means to practice practical nursing as a licensed practical nurse by performing for compensation acts authorized by the board. (1.1) "Approved nursing education program" located in this state means a nursing education program approved by the board as meeting criteria established by the board. An "approved nursing education program" located outside this state means a nursing education program that the board has determined to meet criteria similar to and not less stringent than criteria established by the board for nursing education programs located in this state. In order to be approved by the board, a nursing education program must be one that is offered by: (A) A unit of the University System of Georgia accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; (B) An institution of the Technical College System of Georgia; (C) A postsecondary institution of higher education that is accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; or (D) A postsecondary institution of higher education that is not accredited in accordance with subparagraph (C) of this paragraph, but whose curriculum has been determined by the board to meet criteria similar to and not less stringent than criteria established by the board for other approved nursing education programs.

I recommend the board review this.

Program Approval

Education – 18 – Dignity Nursing School – Developmental Approval

Dignity Nursing School (EDUCATION 18)

Dignity Nursing School (DNS) has requested that the board review and grant developmental approval of DNS's Practical Nursing Program in Nursing. The documents in the Board Packet include a 155-page prospectus with supporting credentials needed to satisfy GBON rule 410-9-.02 (1)-(2) Dignity Nursing School respectfully requests developmental approval.

According to Board Rule 410-9-(6) Program Approval Statuses: (a) Developmental Approval. The Board may grant Developmental Approval to a proposed nursing education program when compliance with Board Laws and Rules have been demonstrated pursuant to Rule 410-9-.02(4). (4) After the Board has received and reviewed the letter of intent and the materials pursuant to Rule 410-9-.02(2) and (3), the Board shall conduct site visits to the proposed nursing education program and all of its affiliating clinical facilities. . (See documentation in the Board Packet on the Bridge).

I recommend that the board approve developmental approval for Dignity Nursing School.

Education – 29 - Andrew College – Site Visit

Andrew College (EDUCATION 29)

Andrew College was visited on Monday March 11, 2022. The administration, faculty and staff were very welcoming. I was there for six hours. I met with faculty and administration. I received a tour of the facilities.

Education – 30– Clayton State University – Site Visit

Clayton State University (EDUCATION 30)

Clayton State University was visited on Monday March 21, 2022. The administration, faculty, and staff were very welcoming.

Recommendations:

 - b. All classes to return to face-to-face format during the fall 2022 semester.
 - c. Faculty abstain from utilizing any test questions used during the period of online teaching, 2020-2021.
 - d. New standardized testing policy that was included in each syllabus for all nursing courses Fall 2021 that includes mandatory remediation.
 - e. Students will re-take the appropriate Kaplan exam, that they failed to meet the established benchmark on, after they completed the student success self-study course (one-hour, seven week, mini-mester course).
2. Review Board Scores 6/30/2022 and 12/30/2022 to assess implementation of Plan of Action

Education – 27– Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College – Site Visit

Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College (EDUCATION 27)

Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College was visited on Monday March 28, 2022. The administration, faculty, and staff were very welcoming.

Recommendations:

- 1) Reevaluate student resources. President suggested changing to ATI.
- 2) Reduce Dean’s teaching load to one class per semester, secondary to decrease in board scores. In addition, Dean’s time is split between the Bainbridge and Tifton campuses.
- 3) Analyze differences between curriculum and teaching plans at Bainbridge, which has a 90% pass rate and the Tifton Campus.
- 4) Continue implementing Plan of Action submitted to the Board February 2022.
- 5) Review Board Scores 6/30/2022 and 12/30/2022 to assess implementation of Plan of Action

Education – 32– Herzing University – Site Visit

Southern Regional Technical College - PN (EDUCATION 33)

Southern Regional Technical College (PN) was visited on Thursday April 21, 2022. The administration, faculty, and staff were very welcoming.

Recommendations:

 - a. Admission Grade Point Requirement
 - i. Increase from 2.0 to 2.8 Fall 2022 per Mr. Glass, President
 - b. Pre-Admission Testing
 - i. Increase from 70% to 78%

Albany State University (EDUCATION 28)

Albany State University was visited on Monday April 25, 2022. The administration, faculty, and staff were very welcoming.

Recommendations:

- 6) Appoint an Assistant Chair to assist chair secondary to 36 faculty and 13 adjunct faculty
- 7) Reduce Dean's teaching load to one class per semester, secondary to decrease in board scores. In addition, Dean's time is split between the BSN, BSN-A, ASN, ASN-Bridge and master's programs and campuses in Albany and Cordele.
- 8) Review Board Scores 6/30/2022 and 12/30/2022 to assess implementation of Plan of Action

Education – 31– Gordon State College – Site Visit

Gordon State College (EDUCATION 31)

Gordon State College was visited on Wednesday March 27, 2022. The administration, faculty, and staff were very welcoming.

Recommendations:

5. Implement Plan of Action
 - a. Implement 2.75 GPA for Math and Science
 - b. Consistent Faculty for 4th semester.
 - c. Director of Nursing, Dr. Samantha Bishop, who is a relatively new dean, to decrease teaching to no more than one class to spend more time on administrative duties including reviewing courses across ASN and BSN curriculum (prior to her starting the Director position, both ASN and BSN program directors).
 - d. New full time Pediatric Faculty to replace Dr. Bishop
 - e. Hire a Simulation Coordinator/Lab Manager
6. Review Board Scores 6/30/2022 and 12/30/2022 to assess implementation of Plan of Action

School Complaints

Education – 01 – Atlanta Technical College – School Complaints

Atlanta Technical College (EDUCATION 01) Five complaints came through webform regarding grade changes, testing change, faculty rudeness and disrespectful. I spoke with Dr. Katrina Walker, and she will be present to answer any questions.

Education – 02 – Coastal College of Georgia – School Complaint

Coastal College of Georgia (EDUCATION 02) The board of nursing received a complaint via webform regarding the student's inability to attend clinical at a facility that required the COVID vaccine. Emails and announcements from the Dean explained in January that clinical placement restrictions come from the clinical facility and not the school or USG.

Education – 03 – Columbus State University – School Complaints

Columbus State University (EDUCATION 03) Two complaints came through webform. One was a concern regarding conditional approval and students not being aware. The second was regarding inadequate teaching and students being concerned about an instructor that was fired mid semester due to accidentally injecting a student with insulin.

Education – 04 – North Georgia Technical College – School Complaint

North Georgia Technical College (EDUCATION 04) The board received complaint via webform from a senior student who was concerned about Pediatric Clinical placements in the summer. "As a cohort, we have been informed that our pediatric clinical experience will be provided by attending summer camp for kids. There are 4 weeklong camps to which students have been individually assigned. However, the concern arises with lack of opportunity for learning new skill set as would be obtained in an actual pediatric clinical environment, i.e. office or hospital. At two of the camps, Camp Hawkins and Camp Kudzu, students will not provide nursing care and will be a "buddy" to a disabled child for 24 hrs./day x 6-7 days. Another, Camp Braveheart, which is hospice affiliated, is a weeklong day camp where the students will also be a "buddy" to a child who has lost a loved one, again no pediatric clinical skill set. One of the camps, Camp Barney, fortunately, will have students working in the camp clinic; however, as stated earlier, not all students are assigned to this camp."

Education – 05 – Northwest Georgia Technical College – School Complaints

Northwest Georgia Technical College (EDUCATION 05) Two complaints came through webform regarding not having clinical faculty in the mental health and OB setting. These clinicals are being considered “observation only”. Student safety was a concern and not following board policy to have a 1:8 ratio for faculty to students in an inpatient facility.

Education – 06 – Savannah Technical College - Site Visit Recommendations from July 13, 2021

Savannah Technical College (EDUCATION 06) In response to an email I wrote to Savannah Technical College regarding status of recommendations from my July 13, 2021 site visit, some being pushed out to 2023 to implement.

Education – 07 – Southern Regional Technical College (PN) – Pilot Program with CRMC/CCHS

Southern Regional Technical College (EDUCATION 07) An email was received regarding a social media post about the start of a pilot program between Colquitt Regional Medical Center and Colquitt County High School and SRTC. It stated that “SRTC and CCHS have created a pathway for them to graduate high school with their LPN!”

Courses in the natural sciences must have class and laboratory components.

The approved substantive change was to begin accepting students on the Walton Campus this coming summer 2022 semester. Due to delays in construction, we may need to push the start date to Fall 2022 semester.”

Education – 16 – Herzing University

Herzing University (EDUCATION 16)

The board received a copy of a letter to Renee Herzing President of Herzing University on March 22, 2022 informing the board that “This review will assess Herzing’s administration of the Title IV, HEA programs in which it participates. The review initially will cover the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 award years but may be expanded if appropriate. The Department of Education (Department) considers the administration of the Title IV, HEA programs to be an institution-wide effort. Consequently, the review will include all offices involved in the financial aid administration: •Financial Aid office•Registrar office•Academic office•Admissions office•Fiscal/Business office”

Education – 17 – Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine – Considering BSN program

Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) (EDUCATION 17)

The President of the Board received a letter stating that PCOM was considering starting a BSN program at its Suwanee Campus. In addition, they are considering an RN to MSN bridge.

Education 20 – South University – Considering BSN program

South University Savannah (EDUCATION 20)

I met with South University on April 12, 2022. They wanted to discuss opening a BSN program on their Savannah Campus. On April 14, 2022 I received an email from Cyndi Faudree, DNP, APRN, FNP-BC, ACNP-BC Assistant Dean College of Nursing and Public Health Undergraduate Nursing Programs and Assistant Professor who had a person she would like to hire as nursing administrator to start the school. The person had three year of part time teaching experience in an RN program. I was uncomfortable giving an answer to whether this would be appropriate. I did not feel the rule is met with only part time experience. I am asking the board's opinion.

Education 34 – Gordon State College – DUAL enrollment

Gordon State College (EDUCATION 34)

The board received a letter from Gordon State College, Dr. Samantha Bishop, Director of Nursing informing the board that Gordon State has established an articulation agreement with Lamar County High School to offer five students who meet the admission criteria with certain requirements of general education taken via dual enrollment. The criteria is listed in the email on the bridge.

Education 22 – NCSBN Annual Report Program in Qualtrics – Possible Change

NCSBN Annual Report Electronic Program – (EDUCATION 22)

NCSBN reached out to the Board notifying them of an electronic Annual Report that Georgia could use. There is no cost to this program, and it could simplify our data collection as NCSBN would give us our data. Here are answers to some questions I asked NCSBN:

1. Data collection and report: We develop the link with our 49 core questions and any of your additional questions. Then we send it to you to send to your programs. The directions give our email address for any questions your faculty might have so as not to bother you. We collect the data, via Qualtrics, and then develop a report for you, with graphs, pie charts, tables and matrices, depending on the question. We also send you the raw data.
2. Analysis: We annually provide an aggregate report, which we share with participating BONs, with descriptive data and data related to the quality indicators being met. Therefore, you can benchmark Georgia's data with those from all the participating BONs. The programs can benchmark their data, as well.
3. Future Analyses: Every 3-5 years, when we have more data, we will do some sophisticated modeling of the data to see if there are any new quality indicators. I am hoping that, for example, eventually we might be able to identify a minimum number of clinical hours that will be associated with better outcomes. Our outcomes will be trends of NCLEX pass rates and approval status.
4. Data Access: You have access to all your state's raw data. The data are stored on a secure database within Qualtrics so that we can do future analyses.

Documentation of one of the following within four years immediately preceding the date of application: Five hundred (500) hours of licensed practice as a licensed practical nurse as documented on the verification of employment form provided by the Board; or Graduation from a nursing education program as defined in O.C.G.A. §§ [43-26-32\(1.1\)](#) (**see below**); or Completion of a Board approved reentry program as defined in Rule [410-4-.04](#).

O.C.G.A. §§ [43-26-32\(1.1\)](#)

(1) "Active practice as a licensed practical nurse" means to practice practical nursing as a licensed practical nurse by performing for compensation acts authorized by the board.

(1.1) "Approved nursing education program" located in this state means a nursing education program approved by the board as meeting criteria established by the board. An "approved nursing education program" located outside this state means a nursing education program that the board has determined to meet criteria similar to and not less stringent than criteria established by the board for nursing education programs located in this state. In order to be approved by the board, a nursing education program must be one that is offered by:

(A) A unit of the University System of Georgia accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools;

(B) An institution of the Technical College System of Georgia;

(C) A postsecondary institution of higher education that is accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; or

(D) A postsecondary institution of higher education that is not accredited in accordance with subparagraph (C) of this paragraph, but whose curriculum has been determined by the board to meet criteria similar to and not less stringent than criteria established by the board for other approved nursing education programs.


