<u>Call to Order</u>: Dr. Bradley established that a quorum of the Board was present and called the meeting to order at

9:34 a.m.

Dr. Wright motioned, Dr. Corry seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to accept the meeting agenda as posted.

## 1. October 19, 2022 Board Zoom Meeting Minutes

Ms. Sewell motioned, Dr. Corry seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to accept the October 19, 2022 Board Zoom Meeting Minutes as presented.

Dr. Wright motioned, Ms. Sewell seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to accept the October 20, 2022 SB 604 Subcommittee Zoom Meeting Minutes, and the November 17, 2022 SB 604 Subcommittee Zoom Meeting Minutes as presented.

Dr. Malphus provided an update on the SB 604 Subcommittee meetings. The subcommittee is meeting roughly once a month and have been fact gathering. She stated the main issue now is getting the technical departments involved from all interested parties to ensure there will be no issues with the synchronization of data should the change of departmental agencies be made. Ms. Price stated that there was a meeting with Maggie Haisty, Legislative Director of the Georgia Office of Secretary of State (SOS), and representatives from GVMA and the Georgia Department of Agriculture (GDA) for the purpose of discussing the reasons the parties have a desire to move the Board and why

the bill is at play. Customer service was given as the bottom line. It was underscored that those pressing for the change stated a need for a more dedicated staff to assist licensees.

Ms. Price apprised the Board and meeting visitors of the Subcommittee suggestion for polling licensees regarding their experience with the SOS Office, and the possibility that fees may need to increase should the Board be moved to the GDA. GVMA is to work on a draft of this survey. Once created, and if approved by the full Board, the Division Director must grant staff approval to send the survey out via email to all licensees. It was determined that it would be best for the survey to go out from the Board office instead of through GVMA due to the fact it will reach all licensees and not just the GVMA membership. The Subcommittee wants to be made aware of the issues licensees have so that those concerns may be addressed regardless of whether the Board is moved to the GDA.

## 4. December 13, 2022 Investigative Committee Zoom Meeting Minutes

Ms. Sewell motioned, Dr. Wright seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to accept the December 13, 2022 Investigative Committee Zoom Meeting Minutes as presented.

## <u>Licenses to Ratify: October 12, 2022 – December 7, 2022</u>

Dr. Malphus motioned, Dr. Corry seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to ratify the licenses by application and by reinstatement that were issued in accordance with Board Rules and Policies, between Board meetings.

# <u>Correspondence – GVMA GVTAA Letter of Correspondence Regarding Use of LVT</u>

Jaime Rauscher addressed the Board to provide some background into their letter to the Board regarding the use of the initials LVT to represent licensed veterinary technicians. Dr Riddick followed by stating that GVMA did have their legal team review the matter and they were of the opinion that the Board could allow for the use of the initials by rule, and a statutory change should not be required. She continued that Veterinary Technician schools are still using the term, RVT, and suggested a letter be sent to all interested parties regarding the use of LVT. Ms. Sewell expressed her agreement for the purpose of identifying LVTs appropriately on name tags, and in hospitals, for example. Ms. Price noted that the Board has already issued letters to programs concerning the lawful terminology as it relates to licensed veterinary technicians. She further stated that the Georgia Veterinary Practice Act appears to allow the Board to make the distinction in rules. She remarked that if it is the will of the Board, there would need to further discussion about it in order to initiate the rule promulgation process. Dr. Malphus underscored the need for technicians to be recognized in the manner the law dictates.

Dr. Malphus motioned, Dr. Cuevas seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion to refer the GVMA GVTAA letter to the Rules Committee for further discussion and to generate recommendations to the Board.

### Georgia Professional Health Program, Inc. - Robin F. McCown, Executive Director

Ms McCown addressed the Board stating they met with the Investigative Committee December 13, 2022 and noted they will be part of their meeting on a regular basis in an effort to increase their visibility just as they do with the Georgia Medical Composite Board. She stated that there is no timeline yet for the inclusion of veterinarian technicians as the GaPHP continues to work on ensuring that they have the bandwidth for the veterinarians first.

The election/holidays may delay that decision.

Ms. Sewell made a motion, Dr. Cuevas seconded, and the Board voted to enter into Executive Session in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 43-1-2(k); 43-1-19 (h) and 50-14-2 (1) to receive and review information pertaining to investigative reports, pending cases and enforcement matters and to receive the Assistant Attorney General's report. Voting in favor of the motion were those present who included: Dr. Bradley, Dr. Corry, Dr. Malphus, Dr. Wright, Dr. Cuevas, Mr. Culpepper, and Ms. Sewell.
