VI. OLD BUSINESS AND NEW BUSINESS ITEMS

Old Business – Discussion by Board Members – SEBBI 2023-0001

The Board voted with unanimous consent to give Mr. Joseph Rossi to give a brief presentation on his position and role in SEBBI 2023-0001.

The Board voted with unanimous consent to enter the Attorney General Official Opinion 2005-3 into the record.

Mr. Lindsey moved to agree that the State Election Board should exercise jurisdiction to investigate the Secretary of State's office, Dr. Johnston seconded.

Dr. Johnston voted aye, Mr. Lindsey voted aye, Mrs. Ghazal voted nay, Mr. Mashburn voted nay. The motion failed for a lack of a majority, 2-2.

Dr. Johnston moved to make a request to the General Assembly to make a determination of whether the State Election Board has the jurisdiction to investigate complaints against the Secretary of State's office, Mr. Mashburn seconded.

Mr. Lindsey voted aye, Mrs. Ghazal voted aye, Mr. Mashburn voted aye, Dr. Johnston voted aye. The motion passed, 4-0.

New Business - Discussion by Board Members – “No-Excuse Absentee Voting”

Dr. Johnston presented a proposal for the General Assembly to consider legislation ending or amending no-excuse absentee voting. Mr. Mashburn moved to publish the proposal on the State Election Board's webpage for the public's review, and for the proposal to be open for public comment and Old Business at the next meeting; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 4-0.

The Board broke for recess at 2:30 P.M.

Mr. Lindsey moved to issue a Letter of Instruction to Taylor Bittick; Mrs. Ghazal seconded, passed 3-0. Mr. Lindsey moved to issue a Letter of Instruction to Lamarcus Davis; Mrs. Ghazal seconded, passed 3-0. Mr. Lindsey moved to dismiss the allegations against Lakisia Furlow; Dr. Johnston seconded, passed 3-0. Mrs. Ghazal moved to refer the allegations against Kimberly Shannon to the Attorney General's office; Dr. Johnston seconded, passed 3-0.

SEB2020-107 Chatham County Alleged Theft of Absentee Ballot

After presentation and discussion of the investigative findings, the Board voted with unanimous consent to open an investigation into the actions of Chatham County Board of Elections and

Chatham County Board of Registrars. As to Peter and Ranae Schmid, Mr. Lindsey moved to dismiss the allegations; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 3-0. As to Mark Hiott, Mr. Lindsey moved to dismiss the violation and issue a Letter of Instruction; the motion failed for a lack of a second. Dr. Johnston moved to refer Mark Hiott to the Attorney General's office; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 3-0. Dr. Johnston moved to refer Julia Garcia to the Attorney General's office; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 3-0. Dr. Johnston moved to refer Hattie Mobley to the Attorney General's office; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 3-0.

After presentation and discussion of the investigative findings, Mr. Lindsey moved to refer to the Attorney General's office; Mrs. Ghazal seconded; passed 2-1.

II. PROCEDURE MATTERS

Garland Favorito presented a petition for amendment of State Election Board rules. This petition addressed Storage of Returns. After presentation and discussion among the Board members, Dr. Johnston moved to accept the petition; the motion failed for a lack of a second. Mr. Lindsey moved to deny the petition; Mr. Mashburn seconded; passed 2-1.

Marilyn Marks and Jeanne Dufort presented two petitions for amendment of State Election Board rules. These petitions addressed Ballot Secrecy, and Logic and Accuracy Testing. After presentation and discussion among the Board members, Mr. Mashburn moved to reject the petition addressing Ballot Secrecy; Dr. Johnston seconded; passed 3-0. After presentation and discussion among the Board members, Dr. Johnston moved to accept the petition addressing Logic and Accuracy Testing; motion failed for lack of a second. Mr. Lindsey moved to reject the petition; Mr. Mashburn seconded; passed 2-1.
